## **Impact Fee Grants for Non-Profit Organizations**

Orange County recognizes and encourages the contributions that community-based non-profit organizations provide to its citizens. To help provide community services, the Orange County Board of County Commissioners has created the Non-Profit Impact Fee Grant Program for construction of physical facilities to provide those services.

Since 2000, over \$250,000 in assistance has been granted to approved non-profit organizations to provide quality community and social services to Orange County residents.

Grants of up to \$15,000 are available toward the costs of transportation, sheriff, and fire impact fees charged to construction projects in unincorporated Orange County that provide lasting benefits and community services to Orange County residents.



## Impact Fee Grants for Non-Profit Organizations

### Eligibility Requirements:

- ▶ The non-profit organization must provide services to Orange County residents, including but not limited to, criminal justice diversion, substance abuse treatment, after school programs, homeless shelters, or health care counseling.
- ▶ Orange County residents must have equal opportunity to benefit from the organization's services.
- ▶ The primary purpose of the new construction must be for the provision of the identified service.
- ▶ The non-profit organization must be exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. Code.
- ▶ The non-profit organization must have filed a building permit application with the Orange County Building Division and have a valid permit number for the grant application.
- ▶ Non-profit organizations cannot request a refund of impact fees already paid.
